History

The largest polypropylene facility in the world, the plant was acquired in 1984 from ARCO Chemicals and has since undergone three major expansions.

Capacity

2.7 billion pounds (1.224 ktons) per year

Differentiation

Low production cost facility and full range polypropylene supplier with specialty products to support customer needs.

- 849 million pounds (385 ktons) per year propylene provided by captive supply from Mont Belvieu Propylene Splitter.
- 728 million pounds (330 ktons) per year propylene provided from captive supply at BASF FINA Petrochemicals Limited Partnership Naphtha Steam Cracker in Port Arthur, TX (40% Total Petrochemicals USA, Inc. owned).
